The nurse is missing a lot of clothes that were sent home with children. If your child borrowed clothes from the clinic, please wash and return the clothes ASAP. Thank you!




#### **TOTS and All Aboard**

Open enrollment for 2024-25 TOTS and All Aboard will begin Monday, January 8 at 6:00 AM through Monday, February 5 at 11:59 PM. If your child is currently enrolled in 2023-24 TOTS or All

Aboard, and you plan for your child to return for 2024-25 year, <u>you will still need to submit your enrollment some time between these dates</u>. New families will also submit their enrollment during the same period. Enrollment is limited and will fill first by returning families, then remaining spots are filled by lottery.

What's happening in art OTES families, we are so busy in the art room. Some kindergarten classes have finished projects about the Northern Lights and how to show the element of art -space and some are finishing their paper weavings. They look so good! In First Grade we are beginning .SCISSOR NINJAS! This is a unit on how to be an artist with your scissors and is modeled after the martial arts where you earn "belts" from white to black by being proficient with the skill for that belt and each belt increases in the degree of difficulty. Ask your child to show you how to hold your scissors like an elephant!! Second grade is still working on finishing their sandwich collages and a few have begun a project inspired by one of my favorite artists-Jim Dines. Third grade is still sewing monsters and fourth grade is progressing nicely with their weavings. I can't wait to show you what beautiful things that have made.



# What's happening in PE 2nd-4th Grades

We continued to work on our soccer skills this week. We warmed up with some soccer tag which incorporated dribbling the soccer ball as well as passing. This game really helped get the kids warmed up with all of the running and dodging and they really enjoyed it. We also played Sideline Soccer. This version of soccer keeps everyone involved even if they are not on the field. The players on the field are trying to score goals not in a goal but by kicking the ball past the players who are on the sidelines. The sideline players act as "goalies" trying to stop goals. It is fast paced and a lot of fun.

### Kindergarten and 1st Grades

This group also continued with their soccer and kicking skills this week. They warmed up with soccer tag like the older kids as well. Then they played a kicking game called Knock Down. Each team had 8 bowling pins to defend by playing "goalie." The object of the game is to kick soccer balls toward the other team's pins to try and knock them down. The team that knocks down the most pins in the
