
TOTS and All Aboard

Open enrollment for **2024-25 TOTS and All Aboard will begin Monday, January 8 at 6:00 AM through Monday, February 5 at 11:59 PM.** If your child is currently enrolled in 2023-24 TOTS or All Aboard, and you plan for your child to return for 2024-25 year, <u>you will still need to submit your</u> <u>enrollment some time between these dates</u>. New families will also submit their enrollment during the same period. Enrollment is limited and will fill first by returning families, then remaining spots are filled by lottery.


