HEAD LICE

.

Head Lice is a common community problem and infestations peak from September to February. It is the parent's prime responsibility of assisting in the prevention and management of head lice by regularly checking your child's head for lice. If they are showing signs of head lice such as tickling on the scalp, itching, irritability, difficulty sleeping and sores on the head from scratching, please contact the child's physician. While head lice are a nuisance, it is not a health issue and does not spread disease. For information on how to identify head lice, when to seek treatment and general information about head lice, please see the Oak Trace website under parents and nurse's clinic. If you suspect your child has head lice contact your health care provider for treatment options and let the school nurse know if you are treating a case concerning your child. All information is confidential between the school nurse, parent and child. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to give me a call.



A LA CARTE IN CAFETERIA

Just wanted to send out a reminder that all the elementary schools and WIS are scheduled to start their a la carte offerings on 5 Sept. We had great success with the fruit roll ups last year, so we will continue to serve those. The Goldfish ended up not selling at all, so we donated them to a local church near Oak Trace for their food service program.

We will be adding a juice element this year, so we will still keep the options limited to 1 snack and 1 juice, both priced at \$0.75. If a parent does not wish their child to participate, they are

able to go on to the Lunchtime portal and restrict "Snack" and "Juice" under the restriction list, and those items will not be able to be purchased. A la carte purchases are also not allowed if a child does not have a positive balance on their Lunchtime account unless they pay with cash. This keeps the students from being able to go into negative balances with a la cartes. Per a request last year, we will still be limiting each student to only 1 a la carte purchase per day.

Please see the Child Nutrition Label below. This is one of the few approved juices for K-4 by the USDA and meets all Federal and USDA requirements to be served for that age group. The other option we had was to add the Switch juices, but those cost almost a dollar each for us to purchase, so I wanted to stay in the \$0.75 price range to limit any price confusion. I decided not to put the Switch drinks in the 6 elementary schools, but they did very well at WIS when we had them, so WIS will have the Switch option, while the 6 elementary schools will have the Juicy Juice box option.



RENT THE ROCK!





WHAT'S HAPPENING IN STEM

We had a wonderful week in STEM, and I have now had a chance to see all of the classes. On Thursday we started a new rotation that will take us through September 8th. During this rotation 3rd and 4th grade students are using our Sphero robots to experiment with the connection between rate of speed and distance traveled, as well as using Google Sheets to create graphs and charts. Second grade students are conducting experiments with liquids and solids to see which ones will mix with water to create a solution. 1st graders and Kindergarteners are practicing the skill of observation and creating a design inspired by the book Not a Stick (Book by Antoinette Portis) I hope you all have a fantastic weekend and, as always, please contact me if you have any questions or concerns at
