We had a wonderful week in STEM, and I have now had a chance to see all of the classes. On Thursday we started a new rotation that will take us through September 8th. During this rotation 3rd and 4th grade students are using our Sphero robots to experiment with the connection between rate of speed and distance traveled, as well as using Google Sheets to create graphs and charts. Second grade students are conducting experiments with liquids and solids to see which ones will mix with water to create a solution. 1st graders and Kindergarteners are practicing the skill of observation and creating a design inspired by the book Not a Stick (Book by Antoinette Portis) I hope you all have a fantastic weekend and, as always, please contact me if you have any questions or concerns at gibbsj@wws.k12.in.us.



WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE LIBRARY

We are off and running in the Oak Trace Library! The boys and girls have been super excited to be back and check out some great books! We have been talking about taking care of our library books and I know our students always try to be responsible! Please remind your kiddos to make sure their water bottles are closed in their backpacks OR maybe they keep their library books in a separate part of their backpack! We have also been talking about how it is important to keep their library books in a safe place when they are not reading them! I try to encourage them to keep them in their backpacks because they will always have their books at home and always have them back at school, We read about being **Library Success Stories in 4th** and 3rd grade! Be sure to ask your child what that means! In 2nd grade we introduced non-fiction categories and in 1st grade we talked about picking "Just Right Books"! Our kindergarten friends learned about Sammy the Shelf Marker and made one for their home libraries! I am so thrilled to see our students excited about

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN MUSIC

We have had a busy week in the music room!

Kindergarten- We continue to talk about using our singing, speaking, whispering, and calling voices, and we have finished up the Bow Wow Wow song and movement piece. We are going to begin to start building our repertoire of musical instruments. We are also always working on steady beat. Ask your kindergartener about Re the Raccoon.

1st Grade has been playing a name game, called Bounce
High, Bounce Low while we talk about high and low voices. We are also working on keeping a steady beat, and will begin to start to learn basic rhythm patterns.

2nd Grade is finishing our use of an ABCA pattern and movement to the Deedle Deedle Dumpling Rhyme. Next week we will watch last year's 2nd grade Veteran's Day performance, and begin rehearsing for this year's!

3rd Grade finished up a rondo form piece that they helped create with simple rhythm patterns for summertime activities.



WHAT'S HAPPENING IN ART

Hello Oak Trace Families, We have been so busy learning procedures and working on our first projects for the year.

Our 4th graders are finishing their Todd Parr selfies for the hallway display. They are so cute!

Third graders did an eraser drawing inspired from the book When Pencil Met Erasers. These were tricky and they did a great job on them.

2nd graders are turning OOPs paper that they tore into a picture. It has been fun seeing their minds play with the shapes and transforming them.

1st graders are learning about the element of art called shape and kindergarteners element of art is line.

2nd-4th Grades

We are finishing up our cooperative games unit. This week we played Hula Hut Knockdown. The students had to work together to knock down their other teams hula huts while also protecting and rebuilding their own. It is a fast paced game with a lot of action and they had a great time playing.

K-1st Grades

This week we warmed up with Dice Tag. Students took turns rolling dice and chasing each other when the number 1 was rolled. They also played other tag games like Sharks and Minnows, Freeze Tag and Pirate Ship Tag. We will begin our throwing and catching unit next!
