






















































Students are welcome to bring technology to school as a tool for learning if approved by the classroom teacher and/or administration. If you or your child decides to send such devices, understand that the school is not liable for any loss or damage to the device. All devices should be clearly labeled with the owner's name. No cell phones or smart watches of any form are to be used during the school day including drop off and pick up. If these devices are brought to school, cell phones should be kept in their backpack or bag in their cubby. Smartwatches may be worn but not used to text or communicate during the school day. If a student has continuous reminders to follow this rule, they will be asked to give them to the teacher and at the end of the day it will be returned. If there are continued violations the device may be confiscated and kept in the office and the parent will be required to pick it up. We ask that parents do not text their children during the day; you can contact the office for any questions or concerns. Pictures and videos are not to be taken without prior approval from a teacher or staff member. Students are not to post to social media while on school property, including inside and outside the school building, athletic fields, and school buses.














HEAD LICE

Head Lice is a common community problem and infestations peak from September to February. It is the parent's prime responsibility of assisting in the prevention and management of head lice by regularly checking your child's head for lice. If they are showing signs of head lice such as tickling on the scalp, itching, irritability, difficulty sleeping and sores on the head from scratching, please contact the child's physician. While head lice are a nuisance, it is not a health issue and does not spread disease. For information on how to identify head lice, when to seek treatment and general information about head lice, please see the Oak Trace website under parents and nurse's clinic. If you suspect your child has head lice contact your health care provider for treatment options and let the school nurse know if you are treating a case concerning your child. All information is confidential between the school nurse, parent and child. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to give me a call.

2nd-4th Grades

This week we worked on our throwing skills. We played a game called Hula Hut Throwdown. The object of the game was to earn hula hoops by hitting targets and then build and protect hula hut structures. It is a game that requires lots of teamwork and communication because there are so many jobs to be done during the rounds. This is a fast paced game and the kids left the gym very sweaty. We will continue working on throwing and catching next week with a few new games.

K-1st Grades

We played two games that worked on our throwing and catching this week. The first was Fire and Ice Tag. The students always love this game. Taggers run around and freeze other students. Frozen students can be unfrozen when a student with a "fire" ball tosses it to them and they catch it. They are constantly running and tossing while they try to avoid being tagged. We also played Pin Takedown. This required students to protect a bowling pin while throwing and rolling balls to knock other student's pins down. We will keep working on our throwing

and an ostinato on the xylophones.
