ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students are welcome to bring technology to school as a tool for learning if approved by the classroom teacher and/or administration. If you or your child decides to send such devices, understand that the school is not liable for any loss or damage to the device. All devices should be clearly labeled with the owner's name.

No cell phones or smart watches of any form are to be used during the school day including drop off and pick up. If these devices are brought to school, cell phones should be kept in their backpack or bag in their cubby. Smartwatches may be worn but not used to text or communicate during the school day. If a student has continuous reminders to follow this rule, they will be asked to give them to the teacher and at the end of the day it will be returned. If there are continued violations the device may be confiscated and kept in the office and the parent will be required to pick it up. We ask that parents do not text their children during the day; you can contact the office for any questions or concerns. Pictures and videos are not to be taken without prior approval from a teacher or staff member. Students are not to post to social media while on school property, including inside and outside the school building, athletic fields, and school buses.

ATTENTION THIRD AND FOURTH GRADE PARENTS!

HEAD LICE





WHAT'S HAPPENING IN STEM

We had a wonderful week in STEM! On Friday we finished a rotation. During this rotation 3rd and 4th grade students used our Sphero robots to experiment with the connection between rate of speed and distance traveled, as well as used Google Sheets to create graphs to help us analyze the data from the experiment. Second grade students conducted an experiment with liquids and solids to see which ones will mix with water to create a solution. 1st graders and Kindergarteners practiced the skill of observation and created a design inspired by the book Not a Stick. WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE LIBRARY

Do you remember the Dewey Decimal System? If your child is in 2nd, 3rd, or 4th grade - you might ask them what they know about Melvil Dewey and how he created an organizational system for libraries! We have been really digging into how our library is organized so they can find books on their own! Some students are getting super excited when they are able to use Destiny Discover (our online catalog system) to see if we have the book they want and then actually walk to the "neighborhood" and locate the exact book! It's almost like a doubly excited to use the iPads that are mounted in our library to use Destiny Discover! I have been reviewing book care and fiction vs. nonfiction books with the Kindergartners and 1st graders! They know that fiction books tell us stories and books in the nonfiction neighborhood can give us information! So much to learn in our library!
